Lesson 5

Lesson title: What is it like to be a Bahá'í in Britain today?

Relevant syllabus area: Key Stage 2, "What is it like to be a Bahá'í in Britain today?"

Learning objective:

In this lesson, the children will learn about what it means to be a Bahá'í, as an individual, part of community and part of the world.

This idea will be explored in several ways during the lesson.

- In a video,
- Through PowerPoint slides

Resources needed:

- The PowerPoint file and the audio/visual equipment necessary to present it.
- Access to the internet to play the video that is linked to the PowerPoint Slide Show.
- You also need paper and art supplies as the final activity requires the children to draw a world flag.

Estimated time for the lesson:

Part 1- 10 minutes

Part 2- 15 minutes

Part 3- 20 minutes

45 minutes in total

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Instructions:

- Read through the slide show.
- For slides 4-6, briefly discuss each slide with the children. Ask them how these quotations might inspire a Bahá'í to be a better person.
- On slides 11 and 13, there are links to a video about Bahá'í community activities. On slide 12, ask the children to discuss briefly, 'What does a peaceful community look like?'
- On slide 14, there is an activity where the children can recap what they heard in the video. Click the enter button to go through the activity with them.
- On slide 17, ask the children to draw a world flag that represents that we are all world citizens.
